To bless means to empower for prosperity. The Bible tells us: By the blessing of the upright the city is exalted, but it is overthrown by the mouth of the wicked. The Amplified Bible, Classic Edition renders it: By the blessing of the influence of the upright and God's favor [because of them] the city is exalted, but it is overthrown by the mouth of the wicked. When we bless our city, we influence the atmosphere of that city. The word of God says our city will then be exalted. Imagine if we did this for every city in America — what would happen? With all cities thus exalted, our nation would rise to what God has called it to be. Today, let's bless our cities and change our nation!

Unless the LORD guards the city, the watchman stays awake in vain. - Psalm 127:1 (NKJV)

I declare a blessing over my city today. I bless my city with the protection of the Lord according to the word of God. Azusa, you are blessed by God this day as He watches over you, 24/7. I declare that the favor of God is upon my city today and forevermore.
